# Trail Master's Diary: Deerfield

Walk 'n Mass Volkssport Club invites you to take a step back in time with 6km and 10km walks in historic Deerfield on May 6. Deerfield was first visited by English settlers in 1673 and was incorporated as a town in 1677. It was the site of many skirmishes throughout its early history. At the Battle of Bloody Brook in 1675, the Pocumtuck tribe destroyed the troops led by Captain Thomas Lathrop before being overtaken by reinforcements. In 1704, during Queen Anne's War, joint French and Indian forces attacked the town in the Raid on Deerfield, razing the settlement. Today, Historic Deerfield features 12 house museums from the 18th Century dedicated to the preservation of Deerfield and the history of the Connecticut River Valley with a focus on decorative arts. The district has been designated a National Historic Landmark and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Both walk routes begin in historic Deerfield's picnic area, traveling along picturesque Old Main Street, passing by the museums. Walkers will also visit the campus of Deerfield Academy, a private, coeducational college prep school, established in 1797. Notable alumni include King Abdullah of Jordan, several U.S. Representatives, and actor Matthew Fox. The routes also follow the

Channing Blake Footpath that goes alongside a working dairy farm and traverse open fields. Be sure to keep your eyes open. As POC Jan Varnon and I started walking in one of the fields, we spotted a pair of bald eagles overhead. The 6km route also takes walkers through the Deerfield Academy athletic fields.

The 10km route continues down a country road, passing by farm land that reflects the rural character of Deerfield. It continues on through a residential area, passing behind the Old Deerfield Country Store and Richardson's Candy before returning to historic Deerfield and the finish.

Both routes have an AVA rating of 1B. They are mostly flat, but each route contains one hill. Due to some unpaved surfaces and lack of sidewalks, they are unsuitable for wheelchairs, but are doable for strollers. No dogs are allowed on the footpath by the dairy form

Join Walk 'n Mass Volkssport Club for 6km and 10km walks in historic Deerfield on May 6. While you're there, why not take some time to watch the film at the Deerfield Visitors' Center, tour the museums, or walk a nearby seasonal event in Greenfield and Shelburne Falls, MA, and Brattleboro, VT?
